**2.8 The number of full-time faculty members is adequate to support the mission of the institution and to ensure the quality and integrity of each of its academic programs. (Faculty)**

**Off-site Committee's Response**

The Texas College Faculty and Staff Handbook lists a number of functions of faculty, including teaching a load of 15-16 credit hours per semester, and adds that it is expected that faculty will require “at least” 40 hours a week to accomplish these duties. The College presented tables giving the student/faculty ratios, class sizes, credit hours generated per faculty member, and the number of faculty by division. However, given the teaching load (15-16 credit hours), plus advisement and service expectation, the College did not provide persuasive evidence, as outlined in the SACSCOC “Core Requirement 2.8 Guideline” approved by the Executive Council and published in June, 2014, of having an adequate number of faculty to accomplish all of the faculty duties and still ensure the quality of the educational program.

The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee also noted an irregularity in the semesters used in the 2.8 table “Credit Hours Generated by Full-time and Part-time Faculty.” The column that lists the names of faculty indicates that it is for the year 2011-12, whereas the credit hours columns indicate the data is from academic year 2013-14. Moreover, the semesters reported for 2.8 do not correspond with those reported in other faculty standards. For example, in the Faculty Roster provided for CS 3.7.1, the College provided faculty credentials for faculty who taught during fall 2014 and spring 2015 (whereas the standard’s instructions state to use spring and fall 2014). The semesters of fall 2014 and spring 2015 are also used for CS 3.5.4. For three different standards, there are three different academic years, making it difficult to discern compliance.

**Institution's Response**

The committee found that the College had provided adequate documentation with regard to tables giving the student/faculty ratios, class sizes, credit hours generated per faculty member, and the number of faculty by division. However, there was an irregularity in the semesters used in the 2.8 table “Credit Hours Generated by Full-time and Part-time Faculty” and the documented evidence for other faculty standards. Additionally, the College inadvertently listed different calendar years within the table. Therefore, the College has provided a corrected copy of the table which documents the credit hours generated by full-time and part-time faculty for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 academic

years. Also, documentation is provided for the other faculty standards for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 academic years.

The number of full-time faculty is adequate to support the mission of Texas College in its pursuit of academic excellence while providing a quality liberal arts education. Full-time faculty are teaching faculty who on average teach (15) credit hours as well as, assist with academic advising which is in keeping with the general standards of higher education. Also, faculty members are involved in academic and institutional governance through participation in the curriculum development process, appointments to institution-wide committees, the Faculty Senate, and appointments to college- and departmental-level committees. For example, a significant portion of the faculty's authority and responsibility in academic matters is expressed through curriculum development. The structure of the curriculum development process provides faculty with the responsibility of determining the approval of courses and programs.

The presence of faculty is equally important with committee assignments across the institution to study and recommend policies and activities in a wide variety of areas of college governance. Despite the fact that faculty are assigned to committees; the committees convene at various times throughout the academic year and are not regimented for daily activities. The meeting requirements for the various committees fluctuate and seldom meet for instance: committees may meet twice a year, once every quarter, or monthly. Thus, faculty are not required to spend a lot of time in committee meeting. Likewise, there have not been any problems posed from faculty in the past.

Furthermore, full-time faculty are appointed to ranks of instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, or professor. Likewise, part-time faculty are those members of the teaching faculty who do not hold rank and are contracted to teach half-time or part-time; i.e. less than a normal load that will not exceed nine (9) credit hours. Part-time faculty are also referred to as Adjuncts.

The College maintains an average employment of 35 full-time faculty per academic year who constitute a sufficient resource for carrying out basic faculty functions (e.g., teaching, advisement and additional college services) and prove adequate to fulfill the delivery of degree programs while also supporting the integrity and quality of program delivery. Charts I and II are illustrations of the number of full-time faculty members being adequate to support the mission of the institution. Attachment 1 provides an illustration of credit hours generated by full and part-time faculty for 2013-2014. Attachment 1A further illustrates full-time and part-time course offerings by faculty for the 2013-2014 period. And, Attachment 1B is a sample of how faculty course load forms are prepared.

The mission is, “Texas College is a historically black college founded in 1894, by a group of CME ministers. Our mission, which continues to embody the principles of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, is to *ensure that the student body experiences balanced, intellectual, psychological, social and spiritual development, aimed at enabling them to become active productive members of society where they live and work.*” The range of faculty across several disciplines assures that our students have a balanced curriculum that covers humanities, sciences, social sciences, technology and mathematics. The faculty expertise allows for the coverage of the psychological, social, and spiritual dimensions of the curriculum. Given our expectation that students will engage in service to the community, we give them the proper footing to be productive and active citizens. Our faculty delivers instruction in a manner that fulfills the mission of the College.

The College ensures that the number of full-time faculty are adequate to support the mission of the institution by fulfilling the teaching load policy which states “the average teaching load for full-time faculty is 15 hours per semester. The average teaching load for division chairpersons is 9 hours. For the sciences, the average teaching load is 16 hours,” (p. 61, [Faculty Handbook](#)). Additionally, the College offers assurance through the delivery of the course load by not having a ratio to exceed 30:1. The faculty to student ratio over the five-year period has ranged 20:1 to 27:1 (see Chart III).

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To maintain integrity of the academic programs, the College ensures that all full-time faculty have the appropriate credentials (in keeping with SACS criteria) and expertise to deliver the courses for each major. Moreover, the College has an adequate number of full-time faculty to deliver coursework in a schedule that assists students with graduation in a four year timeframe (providing no remediation or developmental courses are required by the student).

The quality of the academic programs is further ensured by assessing both the faculty and course delivery each term, by students and the College's administration. And, the integrity is maintained by evaluating each semester, limiting the number of students enrolled per course section (not to exceed an average of 30:1), and monitoring the total number of courses offered. Further, the college has a workload policy that governs the number of courses a professor can teach in a given semester and academic year. The College has worked diligently with monitoring faculty assignments each semester to maintain adherence to this policy. This process demonstrates the continuous maintenance of the quality and integrity of the academic programs.

Texas College further ensures that the quality and integrity of academic programs are being addressed through the selection and employment of faculty who have both the credentials and experiences that support the mission and content offerings of the College. Based on spring 2011 data, the number of faculty with earned doctorates is 51% and the faculty retention rate is 91%. The faculty has demonstrated a commitment to the mantra of the mission and institutional vision.



Tolerance - emphasizing openness to divergent points of view, applying an eclectic approach to rational and analytical thinking.


Community Service - encouraging self-extension in service to others as the heart and soul of our educational enterprise.

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## Teaching Load

The average teaching load for full-time faculty members is 15 hours per semester. The average teaching load for division chairpersons is 9 hours. For the sciences, the average teaching load is 16 hours. Overloads are considered when faculty teach beyond 16 hours and division chairpersons teach beyond 9 hours. Full-time loads for select courses are calculated based on contact hours, i.e., activity classes and labs are given this consideration.

## Academic Rank and Promotion

1. Teaching members of the faculty appointed on a full-time basis may be assigned to one of four ranks on the strength of graduate training, years of experience, and evidence of professional competence. These ranks in ascending order are: instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, and professor.
  - a. An instructor must have a master's degree from an accredited institution.
  - b. An assistant professor shall have a minimum of a master's degree from an accredited institution and a minimum of 18 credit hours of advanced study beyond the master's area in the area applicable to the college offering. He/she shall have at least three years of successful college teaching experience and an acceptable rating on the qualitative criteria items "c" through "h", as listed in item number 3 below.
  - c. An associate professor shall have an earned doctorate from an accredited institution, at least five years of successful college teaching experience, and an acceptable rating on the qualitative criteria "c" through "h", as listed in item number 3 below.
  - d. A professor shall have an earned doctorate from an accredited institution in his/her discipline or related area in which the appointment is made, at least six years of successful college teaching, and an acceptable rating on the qualitative criteria "c" through "h", as listed in item number 3 below. In lieu of six years of teaching, the individual may have three years of successful teaching experience plus research and/or related professional experiences, scholarly publications, and membership in learned societies and professional organizations which demonstrate that he/she is a valued member of the academic society.
2. Promotion from one rank to another requires recommendations based on evaluation of performance using certain criteria. Recommendations for promotion should be initiated by the division chairperson preferably before January of each year.
3. Each recommendation should include a written evaluation of the faculty member's work by the division chairperson together with reasons favoring promotion and should be presented to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. The Vice President for Academic Affairs should add comments and present all the information, including his/her own recommendations, to the President of the College. Final approval will rest with the President. In the event the President does not approve the promotion, the faculty member should receive this information in writing, including the reason(s) for the disapproval. The following criteria are considered in making recommendations for initial rank and promotions:
  - a. graduate training;
  - b. years of service;
